During the month of July, I'll be away from our Temple. Three of those weeks will be my annual summer leave. One of those weeks will be a week of study, associated with my sabbatical month.

While pondering a variety of options for my area of study, I decided to phone my new friend, Sheikh Imam Radwan Kouatli of the Boca Islamic Center. You may recall that he was among the clergy who graced our Bimah last November, during our Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service, which was organized this year in association with the Delray Beach Clergy Association, which I have been privileged to serve as vice-president.

I asked the Imam if he would consider spending some time with me during my study week, communicating to me aspects of Islamic teaching that he felt would be useful and informative for me, as a Reform rabbi. Imam Kouatli kindly replied that he would be glad to do so - with one condition - namely, that I, in turn, would answer his questions pertaining to Judaism. A particular area of interest to him pertains to the distinction between Orthodox Judaism, Conservative Judaism, and our own, Reform Judaism.

Subsequent to my return to Temple Sinai, I look forward to sharing with you the insights gained through my studies with the Imam.

In the meantime, Lorraine, Sharon, Michael and Shira all join me in wishing the members of our Temple Sinai Family a happy and healthy summer.

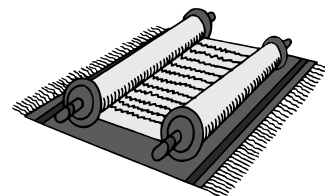

Tikkun Olam. The Sunday religious school also
raised \$200 through contributions and Tzedakah
collections. Together we are making a huge
difference by sponsoring both the lunch program
and other needs of impoverished Jewish families to
help prepare them for their eventual absorption into
Israeli society.

The Social Action Committee continues to support Temple Sinai, the community and Israel. Since January 2007, we have sent three large boxes filled with stuffed teddy bears to Emek Medical Center in Afula, Israel for their sick and injured children. The third annual "Teddy Bear Drive" was a huge success in the months of December and January. Over 50 stuffed animals were also collected at the Rosh Chodesh Hanukkah meeting in December and brought by Temple members and friends. THANK YOU to everyone for their kindness! Members of Sisterhood and their friends and family, under the direction of Dolores Cowen, knitted over 25 soft dogs to be sent for these Israeli children. THANK YOU so much!

Our annual "Mitzvah Day" in February truly benefited our local community and our spiritual homeland of Israel. Over 75 members made hundreds of peanut butter and jelly sandwiches for The Caring Kitchen in Delray Beach (a local food pantry), collected canned foods, used eye glasses, personal hygiene items, decorated "Get Well" cards for the children in two Israeli hospitals and for Rabbi Chaim's hospital visits, and had a very successful Bake Sale. THANK YOU to our Bridge coordinator for purchasing lots of home baked goodies for that Sunday afternoon's bridge players. Everyone did a real big Mitzvah!

The Social Action Committee also coordinated an annual "Let All Who Are Hungry" Food Drive with the Sisterhood's Women's Seder and these donations were contributed to the Forster Family Kosher Food Pantry in Boca Raton.

There was a special speaker for Brotherhood month in February from a local Church in Boynton Beach. Sharing the Bimah with other clergy is an important way for Temple Sinai to appreciate the bonds of Brotherhood with those of different faiths and make them aware of "The Magic of Temple Sinai."

A special guest speaker, Mindy Agler, attended our last Social Action Committee meeting. This was arranged through the efforts of Rabbi Chaim, and Mindy spoke about alcohol and drug addictions. A number of committee members joined Rabbi Chaim for a full day training on May 16th at Congregation B'nai Israel in Boca Raton for further education on addictions and information regarding programs to help those suffering from these illnesses.

Special "Social Action Committee" angels continue to deliver Bimah flowers to sick and hospitalized Temple members. The weekly Friday evening Tzedakah collections are also managed by our committee.

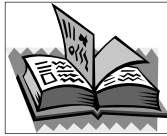

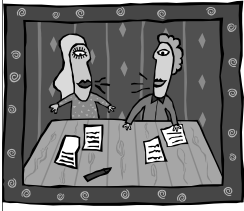
JULY

1. Since there was no male heir for Tzelafchad, his 5 daughters appealed to Moses and the elders for their right to claim their father's land.
2. Pinchas, Aaron, the High Priest's grandson, was in charge of the sacred articles and signal trumpets as well as serving as a loyal soldier.
3. Moses felt overburdened with responsibility and tribal conflicts with so many people and asked for help from the elders to help judge the people.
4. God responded to Moses and said, "Enough." Gaze to the West, North, South and East from the top of the cliff to look over the Jordan River at Canaan.

AUGUST

1. If the Israelites obey G-d's laws, they would become numerous as the stars and become blessed above all nations.
2. The Israelites were forbidden to eat anything with blood. It should be spilled on the ground like water.
3. The judges must administer honest judgment for the people. No one should be given special consideration.
4. The Israelites recall their cruel behavior when they exited Egypt and also because they hired the pagan prophet Balaam to "curse" the Israelites.
